1.26. Racial Bias

During the trial, if you witness one or more of your fellow jurors expressing overt racial bias, you should inform the judge and the lawyers for the parties as soon as possible. During and after the trial, if you learn that racial hostility significantly motivated one or more of your fellow jurors to vote to convict, you should inform the judge and the lawyers for the parties as soon as possible.
